An hour trip from QCAV (Nagoya Congress Center) to the EXPO Nagakute site

Subway, Meiko/Meijo Line (clockwise) 320 JPY to Fujigaoka terminal 9 min. ride (every 10 min.) Subway, Higashiyama Line Linimo (bound for Banpaku Yakusa) Hibino (bound for Fujigaoka) 5 min. walk -340 JPY 23 min. ride (every 3 min.) 12 min. ride (every 6 min.) Nagoya Congress Sakae Fujigaoka Banpaku Kaijo Center 東山線 (EXPO2005 5 min. walk Nagakute site) Nishi Takakura

Subway, Meijo Line (clockwise) 320 JPY to Fujigaoka terminal 9 min. ride (every 10 min.)

- * Other routes are also possible, see EXPO2005 Official Map, etc.
- Go direct to the EXPO Nagakute site after QCAV closing on Friday, 20 (arrive at about 4:30 pm).
- Buy an **Evening Discount Admission Ticket** at a ticket booth of the EXPO site (2300 JPY, for visitors entering the site after 5:00 pm, available only at the EXPO site from 4:30 pm.)
- Be aware that bottles, cans, alcoholic beverages and food are prohibited from bringing into the site.
- Operation time of the Nagakute site: 9:00 am to 10:00 pm (many pavilions close at around 9:00 pm)
- There are many restaurants and food courts in the site.
- You may need to line up and wait for more than half hour to get into some popular pavilions.
- Be aware that the transportation will be very crowded around the closing time of the site.
